## From the Pastor:

The Apostle Paul tells the church at Ephesus: "But speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love" (Ephesians 4:15-16).

Christians "growing up into Christ" speak the truth in love because that practice promotes continued growth of the community of faith.

Love is the glue of the faith community, holding the ligaments and the joints together as each part is working properly, promoting the body's growth in building itself up in love.

The body of Christ, broken for us; the blood of Christ, shed for us; now is manifested in the work we do in his name. Equipped, fed, and growing to be more like him – growing up in his name and for his sake – forgiving, forbearing, healing, and loving as Christ loves us.
